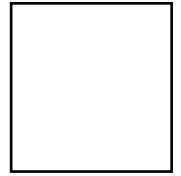
The women's group also sold lunches of barbecue, hot dogs, chips, drinks, and fresh baked goods. Cakes and pies could also be purchased at the bake sale.
